

rehearsing for the performance. Tickets are available in the home, with proceeds going to the resident fund. We're also hoping we can stream the performance for our other homes.


⇒ Advent window: We loved taking part in this Denbury tradition, which sees people lighting their windows on nominated days throughout December. It was our turn on 8th December!

As an Approved Placement Provider for the University of Exeter Nursing Academy, we recently took part in a pilot project of interprofessional, working with a second-year student nurse.


The feedback from the student nurse was very positive, who found the experience "exceptionally beneficial" due to our "knowledgeable and enthusiastic" team. This gave a good insight into how care is provided by services outside of the NHS and emphasised the importance of personcentred care. The results from this pilot project contributed a presentation at the NETworking and Innovation in Healthcare Education Conference 2023 in Liverpool and will be integral to the development of future project work ensuring students experience the complexities, skills and diverse environments social care can offer.

Donkey outing

We wrapped up warmly for a trip to the Donkey Sanctuary near Sidmouth.

This included a chance to get up close to these gentle animals and learn more about their lives at the sanctuary.













Shake Up

We're taking part in a Devon-wide project led by a specialist dietician, which is



exploring ways to reduce the use of prescribed oral nutritional supplements for people who have lost weight or have a poor appetite.

We'll be using a range of nutritional supplement drinks called 'Shake Up'. These are based on natural ingredients and made within the home. The drinks have been very well received in previous trial areas and are having a significant impact on improving the health of care home residents, providing a more natural, better tasting product.



New central training space

We're pleased to launch a new training space at our central office. This has been set up with equipment and resources to deliver a range of face-to-face, practical, and web-based training. Louise, our Managing Director, reports it's been great to welcome the team to training days, which provide an opportunity to learn from each other, as well as the trainer.

Our internal staff development programme runs throughout the year. Since our last newsletter, this has included face to face Safeguarding, Moving and Handling and Emergency First Aid at Work training across the homes.



We carried out our third annual staff survey in October. With five homes and approaching 300 staff, this is an important way to give everyone the chance to let us know what's important to them, and to contribute to the future of Peninsula too.

We had a fantastic response, with 223 people replying – our highest ever level, representing 80% of our staff. Each Registered Manager has their home's results and will be sharing them with their teams shortly.

Team members told us they enjoy their work and strive to provide care in line with our values (Committed, Ambition, Responsible, Embracing). They take great pride in their work and expressed confidence in the company and its future. We have improved our one-to-one staff meetings following previous feedback but this remains an area for future development.

We'd like to say a big thank you to everyone that took part. Wherever possible, please attend the meetings that will be set up to review your home's results. These give a chance to discuss and explore the home's feedback in more depth, helping to identify next steps based on this.



Higher Development Award

We're also pleased to report that Devon and Somerset Fire Services have completed fire safety inspections at all homes (with Plymbridge to follow), with the reports reflecting our commitment to continual upgrades to fire safety. These include a few minor recommendations which we're following up on and we're finalising work on fire doors with external contractors, which will be completed shortly.

All our residents who wished to do so have received their autumn covid booster along with their annual flu vaccination.

Celebrating inclusivity this Christmas

We're busy with festive activities and events this month in our homes as we head towards Christmas and the end of the year.

It's a special time for many of us but we're also mindful that people may mark the season in different ways or celebrate other occasions. With many different traditions and festivals around the world during December, we thought we'd share a few of these in our winter newsletter.

Catalonia: Tio de Nadal ('Christmas Log') is fed every night from 8th December until Christmas Eve, when it is covered with a blanket and hit with sticks until it poops out sweets and small presents as a thank you for being looked after.

Hanukkah: A Jewish festival on the 25th day of the month of Kislev. This is marked by lighting the menorah for eight nights to remember the power of miracles and community.

Nigeria: For those who celebrate, Christmas Day is a family day, filled with dancing and singing all together.

Trinidad and Tobago: Parang folk music is synonymous with Christmas, with people going from house to house in the community. Christmas dinner is turkey, ham and pigeon with rice and peas.

Bulgaria: Following a 40-day Advent fast, an odd number of guests are invited for a vegetarian feast with an odd number of dishes to encourage abundance in the coming year.

Wales: The folk custom of Mari Lwyd ('Grey Mare') sees a horse figure carried from door to door by wassail-singing groups.

Japan: The 'Kentucky for Christmas' ad campaign in the 1970s means KFC is often eaten as a Christmas dinner. More traditionally, Omisoka is celebrated on the last day of the year in a sparkling clean house, a time of reflection and appreciation of the world around us.

"Christmas back home (in the Philippines) always includes lots of family, Videoke (like karaoke) and traditional foods such as pork dishes, seafood and lots of spaghetti. For my first Christmas in the UK, I was gifted my first Christmas pudding and I didn't know that a coin is placed inside, until I found it. It delighted me and honestly made my year."
